

ALOIS AND MARIE GOLDMANN SCHOLARSHIP

YEAR 2010 APPLICATION GUIDELINES

The Alois and Marie Goldmann Scholarship was established in 1997 by Mary and George Freund in honor of George's grandparents who perished at the Auschwitz concentration camp during the Holocaust. The purpose of this scholarship is to promote a greater understanding of the Holocaust among high school students in Idaho.

ELIGIBILITY – Applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a senior at a high school or home school within the state of Idaho.
- Plan to attend an institution of higher learning in Idaho during the 2010-2011 academic year.
- Must submit a completed "Student Application Form" **AND** write an original essay or research paper according to specific guidelines (see information below).

SCHOLARSHIP DEADLINE AND INFORMATION

- Completed application and your essay/paper must be **postmarked no later than March 15, 2010**. Please mail to: Goldmann Scholarship Committee, c/o Idaho Community Foundation, 210 W. State Street,, Boise, ID 83702.
- For the 2010-2011 academic year, the scholarship amount is approximately \$1000.
- The winner will be contacted no later than May 1st, 2010.

ESSAY OR RESEARCH PAPER REQUIREMENTS

To preserve the memory of the Goldmanns and other Holocaust victims, applicants are asked to write an essay or formal research paper on **one specific aspect of the Holocaust**. Please do not write on the Holocaust in general.

- Title page with name of essay/paper, your name, the date. **Please do not put your name on any other pages of your essay/paper.**
- Essay/Paper must be 2 – 6 pages in length (1 – 3 pages double sided).
- Double-spaced using one-inch margins and 10-12 point font.
- Please double check the grammar, capitalization, punctuation and spelling in your essay/paper.
- If writing a research paper, please include a bibliography and references to support your research.

SELECTION OF WINNERS

The primary basis for the selection of a scholarship winner is an original essay or research paper. Beyond a minimum C grade point average, scholastic achievement, financial need and extracurricular or community activities are not factors in selecting the winner. The scholarship committee consists of both Freund family and non-family members.
